

Sound Systems: an introduction to safeguarding One day course (9.30am to 4.30pm)

This course will enable participants to increase their awareness of the main aspects of safeguarding and acts as a brief introduction to issues they may wish to explore through further training.

Learning Objectives:

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

1. Explain the difference between child protection and safeguarding
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the different elements of safeguarding for voluntary youth organisations
3. Identify types of child abuse and the possible signs and indicators
4. State some action points to deal with disclosure from young people or suspicion of abuse
5. Demonstrate the basics of carrying out a risk assessment

This one-day session provides an introduction to safeguarding and explores its key elements; child protection, risk assessment and safe activities. The training draws on the experience of the participants and will involve participative activities such as group work and discussion.

Who should attend?

This training course is designed for all those working with children and young people within the voluntary and community sector.

Trainer Details:

Training is delivered by the training co-ordinator at NCVYS or one of the carefully selected and vetted safeguarding training consultants. Between the group there is a wealth of experience in child protection, health and safety and other safeguarding matters, in the context of youth work. The co-ordinator and consultants have worked in various roles in the voluntary and community sector as well as statutory, and have many years' training design, delivery and evaluation experience amongst them.

This training is one part of NCVYS's Sound Systems Safeguarding project which also incorporates the Sound Systems Accreditation Scheme and the guidance document, *Keeping it Safe: a young person centred approach to child protection and safeguarding*.
